Course OR Master's degree examination in any other subject OR B.A. Pass obtaining at least 45% marks in Gandhian & Peace Studies, History, Political Science, Economics, Philosophy, Psychology, Public Administration, Geography, Sociology, Ancient Indian History-Culture & Archaeology, Women Studies, Human Rights & Duties, Defence Studies, Social Work and Police Administration.  <b>60% Academic Merit and 40% Aptitude Test on Departmental Level (date will be notified Soon)</b>
